# Undergraduate Program Planning

**As you plan your year/semester abroad, please keep in mind the following requirements, policies and guidelines:**

## **Degree Requirements**

The responsibility for satisfying all degree requirements rests with the student. Course requirements for the Bachelor of Arts degree are:

1. Satisfactory completion of 120 credits, at least 60 of which must be Sarah Lawrence credits.
2. Residence requirement
  - a. A minimum of two consecutive years of full-time study through Sarah Lawrence. One of these years may be spent in one of the Sarah Lawrence programs abroad in Oxford, Paris, London, Florence, or in the exchange programs with Reed or Eugene Lang College.
  - b. Full-time study at Sarah Lawrence in Bronxville in either junior or senior year.
3. Fulfillment of the distribution and lecture requirements outlined below.

Students must have satisfied all of the above requirements in order to participate in the May commencement ceremony. Different requirements apply to students who matriculate from the Center for Continuing Education. Those students should consult the Continuing Education Handbook when planning their degree.

## **Distribution Policies and Guidelines**

Sarah Lawrence does not impose specific course requirements, but does seek to give its students a broad and balanced liberal arts background. For this reason, students are asked to plan their programs with their dons in accordance with the following guidelines:

1. The curriculum consists of four academic areas: Natural Sciences and Mathematics; Humanities; Social Sciences and History; Creative Arts. Degree candidates are required to take a minimum of ten credits in at least three of the four areas.
2. Of the 120 degree credits, no more than 50 can be in a single discipline, e.g., math or photography.
3. First-year students must take courses in three different disciplines. Programs with two creative arts courses are not approved for first-year students.

4. Within the 120 degree credits, there is a fixed maximum for each of the four areas. Students may take no more than 60 credits in the creative arts, 80 in the social sciences, 80 in the humanities, and 80 in natural sciences and mathematics. The disciplines included in each area are as follows:

**Natural Sciences and Mathematics:** biology; chemistry; computer science; mathematics; physics.

**Humanities:** art history; film history; music history; language; literature; philosophy; religion.

**Social Sciences and History:** American history; anthropology; Asian studies; economics; environmental studies; European history; geography; history; international studies; political science; psychology; public policy; science, technology and society; sociology.

**Creative Arts:** dance; music; studio arts, including ceramic sculpture, drawing, filmmaking, painting, printmaking, photography and sculpture; theatre; writing.

## **Lecture Requirement**

Students are required to successfully complete four semesters of lecture courses during their first three years at Sarah Lawrence.

**One semester abroad will fulfill one of the four lecture requirements (5 credits). Two semesters abroad will fulfill two of the four lecture requirements (10 credits).**

Students taking two of the following year-long courses in a single year may apply to the Committee on Student Work for a one-time exemption from 10 credits of the lecture requirement: general biology, general chemistry, organic chemistry, general physics. This makes it possible for pre-med students to take additional academic seminars.

# Financial Aid, Grants & Scholarships

## Basic Facts Regarding Financial Aid for Study Abroad

Students who plan on attending one of the SLC programs abroad will be able to apply their entire financial aid package towards the cost of the program. Students attending a non-SLC program may take only federal aid, loans and possibly external scholarships (check with the scholarship provider). SLC gift aid cannot be applied towards non-SLC programs.

## Scholarship and Grant Opportunities

### Hohenberg Grant for Study in South Asia

This grant is available to SLC students who wish to study abroad in India, Nepal, Pakistan or Bangladesh. Awards are based on academic merit and demonstrated interest in South Asia. Please contact Prema Samuel, Director of International Programs for an application. Application Deadline: March 1st for fall/full year, October 15th for spring.

### The School for International Training to Match Hohenberg Scholarship

The School for International Training (SIT) will match any award (up to \$2,500) offered through the Hohenberg Fund for SLC students who have been admitted to the following programs: India: Arts and Culture; Nepal: Culture and Development; Tibetan Studies. To qualify for the matching funds through SIT, students must demonstrate financial need and complete the SIT scholarship application form. Students must also complete the Hohenberg Scholarship application.

Bridging Scholarship recipients receive a stipend of \$2,500 (for students on semester-long programs) or \$4,000 (for students on academic year programs).

## Sarah Lawrence College in Cuba

Sarah Lawrence College conducts a fall semester program at the University of Havana. The program is open to qualified juniors and seniors. Students choose courses from a broad range of offerings at the University of Havana, Foundation for New Latin American Cinema, Cuban Institute for Art and Cinematography and the Institute for Excellence in the Arts (music and visual arts). The course offerings at the University of Havana include topics such as Afro-Cuban culture, Art history, Cuban or Latin American Cinema, Cuban history, Dance, Latin American Studies, Literature, Psychology, Urban and Rural Sociology, U.S.-Cuban relations, and Women's Studies.

All courses are taught by Cuban faculty and are attended by Cuban students. Each student is also required to enroll in an advanced Spanish course taught at the University of Havana.

Our most distinctive feature is our affiliation with CEDEM (Centro de Estudios Demográficos), one of the research centers at the University of Havana. At CEDEM our students will meet with experts whose research and professional expertise focuses on developments in contemporary Cuban society. Students will select

a research topic and will be paired with a professor from CEDEM with whom they will meet on a regular basis (much like a conference). This faculty member will advise and oversee the student's research throughout the semester.

The program is open to qualified juniors and seniors. Since all instruction is in Spanish, students interested in applying for admission to the program must successfully complete Advanced Intermediate Spanish or the equivalent prior to departure.

## Sarah Lawrence College in Florence

The Sarah Lawrence College program in Florence is designed to allow students to study the language and culture of Italy and to choose a course of study in the humanities, visual arts and music. Each student's program consists of three parts: concentrated study of Italian, and two other courses chosen among offerings in art history, history, Italian Cinema, literature, art on paper, art restoration, photography, sculpture and music. Students must enroll in at least one academics seminar. All courses are taught by distinguished Florentine professors. All coursework is conducted in English until students are sufficiently fluent in Italian.

Students who have the sufficient level of language proficiency may elect to take one of their courses at the University of Florence Magistero. Courses in the humanities and social sciences at the University of Florence are supplemented by weekly private tutorials with Italian faculty, who work with students in greater depth on both the material of the courses and the Italian language necessary to study them.

The program is open to both students who have studied Italian and to those who have not studied Italian. All students are enrolled in intensive language courses at their own level. This intensive work is also combined with weekly tutorials.

Students live with Italian families in Florence. Students receive a full year (30 credits) of Sarah Lawrence academic credit for the academic year and 15 credits for the spring semester (open to students who have completed at least one year of Italian). Sophomores and juniors in good academic standing, from both Sarah Lawrence and other colleges, are eligible to apply for the following year.

**The application deadline for SLC students is February 1st for the fall semester/academic year and October 15th for the spring semester. ## *Sarah Lawrence College in Catania*

**D**uring your semester as a student in Catania, the most important city in eastern Sicily, you will live and study with Italians, learning about Italy from inside the culture. At the University of Catania, located in a magnificent Benedictine monastery of the XVII century, you will take humanities courses that emphasize and challenge your knowledge of Italian language and culture. With the Mediterranean before you, you will feel the Greek and Roman centuries beneath your feet, and you will encounter the city's baroque architecture, and wander among its splendid palazzi. With Mt. Etna in the background, you will experience the feeling of living between the highest active volcano in Europe and one of the most suggestive coasts in Italy.

The first two weeks in Catania provide an introduction and orientation to life in this Sicilian city. Each day, students receive intensive language instruction: through reading and writing in Italian, they sharpen their understanding and abilities in preparation for course work at the University, all of which is conducted in Italian. Students explore the city's historical background with tutors, graduate students and professors from the University of Catania. Through excursions that include visits to museums, churches and other ancient sites, students receive a firsthand introduction to Catania's history and culture. During this period, the many excursions help students get their bearings so that, by the time the semester begins, each student can navigate the city by foot or by bus. Trips to local markets familiarize students with shopping customs, visits to libraries acquaint them with collections and policies, and outings to movies and theatres expose them to entertainment options around Catania.

Students on the program also visit Siracusa, one of the most important ancient Greek colonies, with its well preserved theatre, built in the 5th century B.C., and its extensive archaeological museum. A day trip to Mount Etna, the highest active volcano in Europe, provides a close-up perspective on a geological presence of immense importance to the history of Catania and the entire region.

Each student selects three courses from the wide course offerings in the Humanities at the University of Catania (Facoltà di Lettere e Filosofia), including such subjects as Italian literature, Comparative Literature, History of Cinema, Medieval History, History of Philosophy, Music and Drama courses.

In weekly tutorial sessions, required of each course, students meet one-on-one with a faculty member or doctoral candidates selected by the faculty. Tutorials provide an opportunity to discuss the weekly lecture topics in greater depth and help in preparing for end-of-semester exams.

Students enjoy all the rights and privileges of a student at the University of Catania. They have access to all University facilities, including the student dining hall, libraries, and computer and sports facilities. Students are expected to exhibit a high level of independence and assimilation to University life.

Just like local ones, students on the program live with Italian families, learning as much from the experience as they do from their course work. Given that Catania is not a typical tourist destination, the people of the city embrace visiting students with a sincere interest.

Over the course of the semester, students also make four weekend trips around Sicily to experience the many landscapes of the island and the various architectural styles of its cities. A trip to Palermo and its surroundings bring them to the city most exposed to Arab influences; another to Agrigento showcases the Valley of the Temples; yet another, to Trapani and Erice, on the western coast, brings them to medieval villages and at finally a trip to Ragusa, Modica and Scicli provides a taste of these wonderful baroque cities of the south.

# The London Theatre Program

The London Theatre Program is jointly sponsored by the British American Drama Academy and Sarah Lawrence College. The program is designed for undergraduates who wish to experience a British conservatory theatre training program. The faculty includes some of Britain's most distinguished actors and directors.

The core of each student's program is scene study in Shakespeare, high comedy and melodrama. Students also take courses in voice, movement and stage fighting and participate in performances at the end of each term. The program also includes a course in theatre history and a course in dramatic criticism, as well as master classes, talks by leading professionals in the British theatre and frequent trips to the theatre. The program is open to students for either one semester or the entire year (advanced program). Students live in apartments in central London. Students receive 15 Sarah Lawrence credits for each semester. The program is open to juniors and seniors in good academic standing from both Sarah Lawrence and other colleges.

# Sarah Lawrence College at Oxford

Sarah Lawrence College at Oxford is a yearlong academic program in Oxford, England. Based on the tutorial system that is at the heart of the great British universities, the program allows American students to experience a very special mode of education.

Under the SLC at Oxford plan, students take two tutorials with Oxford faculty in subjects of their own choosing. Those tutorials are the core of the educational experience. In weekly individual meetings with her or his tutor, the student studies and explores a particular subject, moving at her or his own pace and propelled by her or his own special interests and questions. These weekly discussions are the basis and impetus for readings and written work. Tutorials are available in all of the traditional humanities and social science disciplines. The program also offers opportunities for studying writing and music history.

Supplementing the tutorials is a seminar which provides a shared intellectual and cultural experience for students in the program. Taught by a member of the Oxford faculty, it includes work in both British history and British literature and is designed to help American students understand the culture in which they are living and to deepen their experience of that culture. Students may also attend lectures at Oxford University, both to supplement their tutorial and seminar work and to expose them to new areas of thought and research.

Oxford offers an exceptional variety of cultural events and activities, and students have every opportunity to become integrated into Oxford life. Membership in the Oxford Student Union, access to student societies, attendance at lectures, concerts and theatre performances all allow students to experience Oxford life to the fullest. Students live in single rooms in a series of houses adjacent to the University. A two-week orientation program before the opening of school allows students to become well acquainted with Oxford's intellectual, cultural and social resources. Students also have the opportunity to take several one-day trips to surrounding areas such as Bath, Stonehenge and the Cotswolds.

Students receive a full year (30 credits) of Sarah Lawrence academic credit. Sophomores and juniors in good academic standing, from both Sarah Lawrence and other colleges, are eligible to apply for the following year.

## *Sarah Lawrence College in Paris*

**S**arah Lawrence College in Paris is a program designed to introduce students to the intellectual and cultural advantages of life in Paris. It provides students with an opportunity to combine study in small seminars with maximum faculty-student contact and study in French institutions of higher learning. The program is open to juniors and seniors whose French is at an advanced intermediate level. Classes are conducted exclusively in French.

The academic program includes one required French language class given by members of the Sarah Lawrence Paris faculty. Students take three other courses in subjects of their own choosing. One must be chosen from the Sarah Lawrence seminars, which include courses in literature, art history, social history, cinema, political science and economics. The remaining two classes may be taken at the University of Paris and at French institutions of higher learning such as the Institut d'Etudes Politiques, the Ecole du Louvre and the Institut Catholique, or more specialized institutions. This program also offers the extensive opportunity for concentrated study in the visual and performing arts.

Each student will be issued a French university ID card entitling her or him to most of the advantages of French student status. The program is situated in the heart of the city on the Left Bank. Housing options include living with a French family, living in a student "foyer" or an apartment. A few dormitory rooms are also available at the Cité Universitaire in Paris.

Acceptance into the program is contingent on a solid academic record and appropriate proficiency in French. Sophomores and juniors in good standing, from both Sarah Lawrence College and other colleges, are eligible to apply for the following year.

# Non-SLC Study Abroad Programs

Students may also enroll in a study abroad program offered by another U.S. accredited college or university. The International Programs Office and the Dean of Studies Office have approved the following study abroad programs for SLC students. More detailed information on each program may be obtained by contacting the program provider directly or the International Programs Office (Westlands 206). Please refer to the index at the back of this handbook for individual program provider web addresses.

Students are responsible for making their own arrangements for admission and must complete and submit the Proposal for Off-Campus Semester Study Form to Beverly Fox, Associate Dean of Studies (Westlands 3rd Floor). This form is available at the International Programs Office and at the Dean of Studies Office and is due by October 15th for spring programs and April 15th for fall/academic year programs. Students should contact Beverly Fox at [bfox@sarahlawrence.edu](mailto:bfox@sarahlawrence.edu) or make an appointment to meet with her in the Dean of Studies office if they have any questions or concerns about their program of study.

Once the program of study has been approved, the final step is to notify Beverly Fox in writing when you have accepted and have made a commitment to attend the program. The Dean of Studies office will then notify the offices of financial aid, housing, bursar and registrar of your forthcoming leave of absence from the College.
